

St Curig - Travels in Celtic lands by Rosie Jones

This is the story of how the son of a 6th century Welsh king became a scholar at a famous university, then a travelling evangelist setting up llans across South Wales, and finally a bishop in Brittany. It is also a story of Celtic connections, of Christian monks and their learning, teaching, travels and mutual support. How did they travel so far in those distant times? Why do their names still echo down the years? How are their histories preserved?

Dealing with events that happened a very long time ago, almost 1500 years, not very much contemporaneous evidence remains. What evidence there is has been copied and re-copied and we're now dependent on records from some hundreds of years later. Rosie has combined desk research with a practical pilgrimage to each of the churches associated with our saint across Wales, Cornwall and Brittany, and presents the evidence convincingly. She has also provided pen pictures of each of the churches, alongside photographs, and provided an incentive for others to make their own visits.
